



NARAL Pro-Choice Oregon: Organizing Fellowship

NARAL Pro-Choice Oregon develops and sustains a constituency that uses the political process to guarantee every person who can become pregnant the right to make personal decisions regarding the full range of reproductive choices, including preventing unintended pregnancy, bearing healthy children, and choosing legal abortion. Our affiliated organization NARAL Pro-Choice Oregon Foundation oversees broad-reaching initiatives that expand reproductive health access and promote health equity for all Oregonians.

We are seeking applicants for a limited duration assignment, with a targeted start date of January 4, 2020 through February 28th, 2021, with an option to recommit for a position that would begin on March 1, 2021 and end on May 21, 2021. This is a remote work position, and access to a personal computer and phone during scheduled working hours will be required (applicants are encouraged to let us know if this requirement would impose any barriers or hardships).

Compensation for this position is \$18/ hour with a cap of 3-5 hours per week.

Job Responsibilities

The Organizing Intern will report to the Engagement Organizer, and will work closely with NPCO's Team to accomplish the following objectives:

- Research and collect data about school boards across Oregon;
- Help engage school board members across Oregon to join NARAL's School Board Members for Reproductive Health Network;
- Work to strengthen NPCO's network of school board members across Oregon with communications and policy support.

Specific responsibilities of the School Board Organizer include:

- Researching and tracking the membership and status of school board members that support reproductive freedom across Oregon;
- Building relationships with local leaders and partners engaged and interested in long-term movement building;
- Organizing actions within local communities to prioritize the health, wellness and safety of all students in Oregon (deep canvassing via phone calls and text messages).

Preferred Qualifications

- Knowledge of and experience with EveryAction, Hustle, Thru-Text, or Thru-Talk;
- Previous experience as a campaign volunteer, with a working knowledge of canvassing, phone banking, as well as an interest in mobilizing and supporting voter-led actions;
- Ability to adapt quickly and accomplish goals set by NPCO's political team;
- Working knowledge and/or interest in policies to advance reproductive freedom, LGBTQ+ rights and racial justice;
- Working knowledge and/or interest in local politics and developing relationships with communities and local leaders;
- Interest and experience in developing and distributing social media messages.

Desired Skills and Attributes

- Strong time-management and organization skills;
- Ability to motivate volunteers to reach goals;
- Strong verbal, written, and interpersonal communication skills;
- Proactive, and adept at problem solving;
- Flexibility to work weekends and evenings on occasion;
- Ability to build strong interpersonal relationships.
